Forest City—Alison E. "Babe" Himmel, 102, of Forest City passed away Thursday, January 12, 2017 at the Havana Health Care. She was born March 23, 1914 in rural Manito the daughter of Allison D. and Lulu L. Singley Meeker. She married Virgil O. Himmel on October 6, 1934 in Manito and he preceded her in death on September 19, 1993. One son Keith, one daughter Patia Vance, one grandson Danny Vance, one granddaughter Kim Himmel and four sisters also preceded her in death. Surviving are one son Daniel (Carol) Himmel of Manito. She has six grandchildren, twelve great grandchildren and three great great grandchildren.

Alison was a teacher having taught in the area local school districts including Tyndal School at Glasford and at Forman in Manito. She retired after 22 years of teaching in 1976. 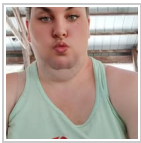

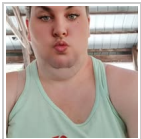
