November 26, 1932 - June 5, 2017

Connie Bea Davis, age 84, of Petersburg, Illinois, passed away on June 5, 2017. She was born on November 26, 1932, in Newark, Missouri, to Osborn McCracken and Catherine Caroline (Bilyeu) Johnston.

After graduating from high school, Connie attended Culver-Stockton College in Canton, Missouri, where she earned her bachelor's degree. She later earned her master's degree from the University of Missouri.

While at Culver-Stockton College, Connie met William "Jerry" Davis whom she married on August 2, 1953. They danced through life together for sixty-three blessed years.

After beginning her teaching career in a one-room country school where she taught all eight grades, Connie taught in several schools in Missouri before moving to Petersburg with her family in 1967. During her twenty-six years at PORTA High School, she taught American History, Sociology, and Current Events. Connie introduced Scholastic Bowl to PORTA and was the sponsor for the Scholastic Bowl team. She was a beloved teacher and colleague. She retired from the Petersburg PORTA School District in 1993 after thirty-five years of teaching. Connie was inducted into the PORTA Hall of Fame in 2012.

Connie was a longtime member of the First Christian Church of Petersburg.

She and Jerry faithfully attended church here and at the Central Presbyterian Church where Jerry is a member.

Connie enjoyed life to its fullest. She loved ballroom dancing with Jerry, traveling the country in their RV, playing bridge with friends, watching Jeopardy, and reading. She attended many school and community activities. She was always entertained by the PORTA Madrigal singers and Theatre in the Park. After she retired, Connie volunteered her time as a Court Advocate for Menard County through Sojourn and tutored at the Menard County Jail. She also volunteered at the New Salem State Park Store and was a member and officer of the New Salem Lincoln League for many years.

Connie was preceded in death by her parents and brother Mackie Johnston.

Connie is survived by her husband Jerry; her daughter Paula (Gerry Faw) Davis of Pensacola Beach, Florida; her son Serge Davis of Petersburg, Illinois; her daughter Marianne Meyer of Lebanon, Missouri; her granddaughters Shanda (Josh) Cullen, Bailey Davis, Holly Davis; and her great-grandson Caleb Cullen.

A visitation will be held at Hurley Funeral Home in Petersburg on June 7, 2017, from 5-7 P.M.

A memorial service officiated by Chaplain Jan Costello, Pastor Diane Ludington, and Pastor Rick Williams will be held at the First Christian Church in Petersburg at 12 noon on Thursday, June 8, 2017.

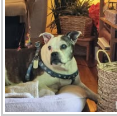
