Donald Edward Ziegenbein, 91, of Manito, passed away at 9:24 p.m., on Sunday, November 21, 2021, at Unity Point Health Pekin. He was born September 28, 1930, in Pekin, Illinois, to Fred and Ruth (Hoerr) Ziegenbein. He married Carol Coombs on June 19, 1976.

Mr. Ziegenbein is survived by his wife of 46 years: Carol Ziegenbein, of Manito. Also surviving are Don's four children: Terry (Marlene) Ziegenbein and Donald Ziegenbein, of Pekin, Linda LaPointe, of Jacksonville, Florida, and Vickie (Allen) Goss, of Pekin; as well as seven grandchildren and several great-grandchildren and step-grandchildren. Don owned his own business, United Service Refractors.

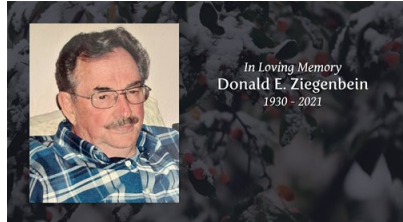
