Fred I. Hall, 79, of Vermont passed away at 6:50 a.m. on Thursday, October 21, 2021 at his home. He was born on November 1, 1941 in Bloomington, Illinois to Frank and Verna L. (Houk) Hall. He married Loretta Bessie Hillig in Lebanon, Missouri on August 18, 1960. She preceded him in death on September 5, 2013.

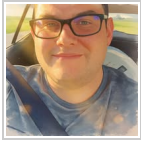
