Orlan E. Trowbridge, 91, of Chandlerville, passed away at 1:30 p.m. on Wednesday, September 20, 2017 at Memorial Medical Center in Springfield. He was born March 31, 1926 to Maurice B. and Sybille (Wiseman) Trowbridge.

Mr. Trowbridge is survived by his sister-in-law, Goldie Trowbridge, of Chandlerville as well as several friends, nieces, nephews and great-nieces and great-nephews. He was preceded in death by his parents and two brothers, Rudy and Richard Trowbridge.

Mr. Trowbridge served in the US Army during WWII, where he saw duty for 18 months in France. He was known as the #1 Chicago Cubs fan in Cass County.
