August 8, 1914 - December 13, 2020

Pauline Phelps Lauderdale, 106, formerly of Glasford and Manito, passed away on Sunday, December 13, 2020 at Hopedale Nursing Home. She was born on August 8, 1914 in Grantsburg, Illinois to Roy O. and Molly Mae (Kerley) Phelps. She married Theo Hiram Lauderdale on September 1, 1933 in Glendale, Illinois. He preceded her in death on Mach 21, 1999 in Peoria. Surviving are two daughters, Patsy J. (Robert) Smith of Manito, Illinois and Barbara L. (Michael) Sullivan of Dunlap, Illinois. Also surviving are six grandchildren, six great-grandchildren, and four great-great grandchildren. She was preceded in death by her parents, her husband, granddaughter Kimberly (Smith) Kelly, her half-sister Lavina (Phelps) Rotola, and her half-brother Roy E. Phelps and his wife Barbara.

Pauline was a skilled homemaker, gardener, and seamstress. In her later years she loved needlework, especially crocheting, as she made pieces of work as gifts for her family and friends.
