Pearl L. Clementz, 103, of Peoria, formerly of Manito, passed away at 4:00 a.m. on Friday, January 20, 2023, at Apostolic Christian Skylines, in Peoria. She was born June 13, 1919, in rural Manito, Illinois, to Glen and Viola (Withers) Talbott. She married George F. Clementz on August 7, 1938, in Havana. He preceded her in death on May 17, 2009.

Mrs. Clementz is survived by one son, Dr. Greg (Linda) Clementz, of Park Falls, Wisconsin; two granddaughters: Abby Rogers, of Effingham, Illinois, and Deanna (Neil) Wilkie of Chicago, Illinois; as well as two great-grandchildren: Dylan Clementz and Ava Rogers.
