



Roberta "Bobbie" Lea Johnson

Roberta "Bobbie" Lea Johnson, 94, of Springfield, Illinois, formerly of Manito and Petersburg, Illinois, passed away on December 20, 2023, at Springfield Memorial Hospital. She was born May 27, 1929, in Manito to Ernest Albert and Hazel Irene (Tackman) Beebe.

For the last 10 years, Bobbie was a resident of Concordia Village, where she remained active in the Senior Living Community, serving on the Welcome and Scholarship committees and leading the Ladies Discussion Group. She loved and treasured her friends, neighbors, and the wonderful staff at Concordia.

Bobbie attended Laurel United Methodist Church. She, and her late husband Gene, owned and operated Gene's Food Stores located in Manito, Petersburg, Bloomington and Pontiac, Illinois. She was the first female to serve on the board of directors for the National Association of Retail Grocers US, honored to have her name published in the "Who's Who Book of American Women", and earned the rank of Worthy Matron as a member of the Order of the Eastern Star. Bobbie also served on the board of the First National Bank in Petersburg. She was a Mason County Lady Landowners member, civic-minded, and always eager to be of help to others. She will be missed by many.
