*So sorry to hear of Ronny's passing. It's been probably 25 years since I've seen you guys at an alumni banquet.*

*You may not remember but Ron and I worked together for Dick Knuppel when we were all young and indestructible. We shared some adventures together. Dick was into all sorts of different work, so we moved old grain bins, baled tons of straw and hauled it to his house on a truck that we had put an over the cab rack on, spread limestone and applied anhydrous amonia. We farmed, built grain bins, hauled grain and many other things. It was a real adventure going to work in the morning because we had no idea what we might be doing that day. One of the scariest things was building a grain dryer at the elevator in Forest City, at least for me. Bins were almost completely built while standing on the ground, but for this dryer we had to climb up the inside to bolt each new section together while it was being lifted by a crane. It wasn't bad until we got up to 30 or 40 ft off the ground. I finally had to give up the inside job and start building the sections on the ground. I think Ron took my place on the inside.*
